MEMORANDUM FOR Commanders, Directors, Office Chiefs of Team WSMR

SUBJECT: Policy Letter #6: Improper Superior or Subordinate Relationships (Fraternization)

1. Improper relationships are prejudicial to good order, discipline, and unit morale. Accordingly, all personnel must avoid such relationships.
2. Commanding officers and supervisors are responsible for taking action as appropriate for those involved in improper relationships as defined in AR 600-20, paragraph 4-14.
3. Professionally competent leaders take care of personnel, look out for their welfare, hear their complaints, and work to promote harmonious relations. Leaders must ensure subordinates feel free to approach them for counsel and assistance; however, such relationships must be maintained without relaxing discipline. A close working relationship between leaders and subordinates must not be allowed to develop into an improper one.
